THE VINEYARD

24 acres located in Chalk Hill, between the cool Russian River, the warm Alexander Valley and the Knights Valley. Volcanic ash & clay loam soils.

THE VINIFICATION

Small lot fermentation in thermo-regulated stainless steel tanks.

4 days of cold soak followed by alcoholic fermentation.

The malo-lactic fermentation follows in barrel.



THE CULTURAL PRACTICES

Organic farming.
Only one irrigation before
véraison.
Rainwater harvesting.

THE BLEND

75 % 13 % Cabernet-sauvignon franc

12 % Merlot

THE AGEING

16 months in french oak barrels.
65% new oak.

ACAIBO IS THE RESULT OF GONZAGUE & CLAIRE'S UNION, OWNERS OF WORLD-RENOWNED BORDEAUX CLASSIFIED GROWTHS. LONGING TO SHARE A NEW ADVENTURE, THEY FELL IN LOVE WITH A 24-ACRES PROPERTY, IN THE HEART OF CALIFORNIA, IN 2012. THE RESULT OF THIS EPIC JOURNEY WAS ACAIBO, THAT TAKES ITS NAME FROM THE NATIVE PEOPLES OF SONOMA, MEANING « THREE FISHES ».

ACAIBO, A MIX OF FRANCO-AMERICAN KNOW-HOW AND TRADITIONS, IS AN EXCEPTIONAL WINE, AS REFINED AS IT IS BALANCED BETWEEN FRESHNESS AND FULLNESS IN THE MOUTH. IT IS MUCH CLOSER TO TRADITIONAL BORDEAUX WINES THAN TO TYPICAL CALIFORNIA WINES.

Vineyard of 24-acres in Chalk Hill, in Sonoma County. Chalk-Hill is at the crossroad of 3 other great appellations of Sonoma: Russian River, Knight's Valley, Alexander Valley.
The Terroir Termal amplitude with cool nights and hot days ideal for growing Cabernet Sauvignon. The soil consists of clayey silt on volcanic rocks.
Organic pratices throughout the vineyard and the desire to have the lowest possible carbon footprint.

Optimization of water:

Two rainwater collection lakes irrigate the entire vineyard.

Sap Flow sensors allowing rational use of water, only twice a year on average.
